1. Time to think about the 2008-2009 school year.
We hope that you have enjoyed a restful summer and are renewed and ready to begin a new school year. We realize this is a busy time of the year but are sending this list serve because of some time sensitive information.

2. Rotary Grants for University Teachers:

Teach in a developing country for 3-10 months with funding for up to \$24,000! Higher-education faculty can teach abroad through Rotary Grants for University Teachers. The program builds international understanding and fosters development while strengthening higher education in low-income countries. It also aims to establish ties between higher-education institutions, leading to the exchange of ideas and information worldwide. Grant recipients must teach subjects relevant to the local population's needs and contribute to the area's socioeconomic development.

The application deadlines are coming up SOON, so contact your local Rotary club. The 2009-10 grant applied for in 2008 would be for service starting after 1 July 2009.

Eligibility criteria

- Applicants must have held a full-time college or university appointment for at least three years but don't need to have held a specific rank.
- The subjects taught must be of practical use to the host country.
- Applicants' home and host countries must contain at least one Rotary club.
- The proposed host institution must be located in a low-income or developing country, as defined by the World Bank.
- Applicants must be proficient in the language of their prospective host country.
- Applicants may be Rotarians or non-Rotarians.
- Awards are not restricted by gender, age, or marital status.
